Year 10 Geography Trip to Hunstanton

On 7 October, Year 10 went to Hunstanton to complete their GCSE fieldwork exercise. After a week of rain the sun came out and we were able to get down to recording data to assess the importance of the sea in shaping the Hunstanton coastline. One group started on the sand dunes looking at plants and evidence of human activity, which was not too difficult given the beach huts, whilst the other group were busy measuring slope angles, pebbles and sea defences at New Hunstanton. Excellent progress was made by the students with a number of individuals showing leadership potential in keeping the rest of their team on task.



In the afternoon, the two groups swapped over, stopping to observe the crumbling, colourful cliffs and admiring the wide open views produced at low tide. Both sets of students stuck to their task well, measuring somewhere in the region of 200 pebbles each. This will enable them to see how the sea moves pebbles along the beach at the same time as wearing them down. The speed of work also meant there was time for an ice-cream before getting back on the bus with plenty of data for their controlled assessment projects.



On the evening of 12 October, an intrepid band of Years 9 and 10 students saw weeks of (very) hard work come to fruition at the Key Theatre as they performed their adaptation of William Shakespeare's "Measure For Measure". The performance was part of the Shakespeare Schools Festival, a nationwide celebration of The Bard's works, in which 650 schools across the UK perform abridged versions of Shakespeare's plays.

Our performance evening also featured shows from Ormiston Bushfield Academy and the Thomas Deacon Academy who performed "The Taming of The Shrew" and "A Midsummer Night's Dream" respectively. The evening was a tremendous success with all schools presenting imaginative and engaging versions of these classic plays.

Our own performance was of "Measure for Measure", one of Shakespeare's lesser known plays. It is a dark tale of treachery and blackmail; a corrupt leader seeks to force a virtuous young maid into giving up her virginity in order to save her brother. The level of maturity and skill shown by our students in successfully staging such a challenging play should not be underestimated and the reactions from the audience were overwhelmingly positive.

The students involved have taken a huge amount from studying Shakespeare in performance, engaging with the language in the way that it was supposed to be enjoyed. They gave up lunchtime after lunchtime, evening after evening and worked incredibly hard to bring language and ideas from centuries ago to life and we are incredibly proud of them.
