# **IMPORTANT COLLEGE NEWS**

## **College First Aid Provision**

We would like to remind parents that we provide basic First Aid in College for illness and injury that occurs during College time only. Our First Aid personnel are unable to make a diagnosis or treat matters that occur at home ... your GP is the best person for this. Please bear this in mind when deciding to send your child to College with a possible health problem / injury as a considerable amount of time is spent contacting parents.

If your child becomes unwell during the day however, and we feel it necessary for them to go home, it is the responsibility of parents and their elected contacts to arrange collection and transport home. Would parents / carers please also bear this in mind when issuing us with contact information for your child and ensure that all named contacts have a means of transport or are willing to hire a taxi. Should any details relating to your child's contacts / medical conditions change, please let the College know as soon as possible.

The College is unable to give medication to <u>any</u> student unless it has been prescribed by a Doctor. All medication brought into the College is required to be kept in a locked cupboard in the Medical Room. A consent form available from the Medical Room will also need to be completed by parents / guardians. Should a student not on prescribed medication have a headache, the parent / carer may be requested to bring some into the College. Please note that unless medication requires being taken with food or is prescribed four times a day, it is not necessary for the medication to be held in College.

Your co-operation in the above would be very much appreciated.

## **Reporting Your Child's Absence**

Just a reminder to Parents / Carers that when you are reporting your child's absence, could you please phone the **Pupil Sick Line** on **01733 254020** on your child's first day of absence, stating:

- how long your child will be absent (if you know),
- your child's name and Tutor Group, and
- reason for absence.

Should your child be absent for further days, could you repeat this on a daily basis as required. Thank you.

## **Students Leaving School**

If a parent / carer wishes a student to leave school during the day, they must:

- Bring a signed letter of permission
- Show the letter to their Form Tutor and have it signed by the Form Tutor at morning registration.

Take the signed letter with them to the Medical Room in order to sign out before going to Reception.
