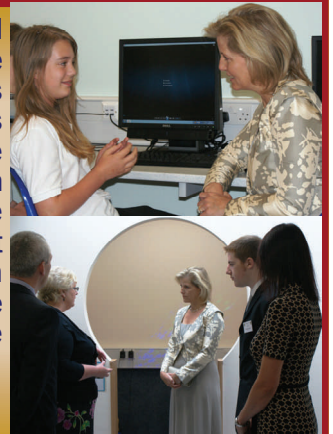

A group of students from Arthur Mellows have been involved in the challenge, which is proving to be one of the most popular and established Maths challenges in the country.

The challenge involves students working together in small teams, who compete against each other in an effort to win a grand prix type race using simulation software and become UK champions.

The activity involves a wide range of basic mathematical skills, some practical, being used and applied. We managed to win through a regional heat and have just missed out in a semi-final, finishing 14<sup>th</sup> in the Key Stage 3 category. The top 12 from hundreds of entries, won their place to the final held at the Heritage Motor Museum in Warwickshire. This was a terrific achievement as it was our first year getting to know the software.

# PRESENTATION EVENING 2011

On Thursday 7 April 2011, Arthur Mellows Village College held its annual Presentation Evening, during which certificates and awards were presented to a representative number of students indicative of real success achieved at all levels. It is a tradition that such successes have become an established expectation at Arthur Mellows.

Academic results, however, are only one indication of success. In other areas, particularly sporting and cultural, many individuals and groups of students have been involved at all levels. Our students show enthusiasm which is most creditable to themselves, their parents and the College staff who care for them.

Our guest speaker this year was Anthony Bartram, Midlands Reporter, BBC Network News. Anthony was a former student of Arthur Mellows. Anthony left Arthur Mellows in 1989 after persuading a local newspaper to sponsor him through Journalism College and after a year of studying, Anthony joined the Peterborough Standard group of newspapers as a trainee/tea boy.

Anthony moved to the Evening Telegraph as a crime reporter and recalls on his first day that the editor who hired him was sacked! Anthony eventually moved to the BBC, for Radio Cambridgeshire. Whilst at the BBC Anthony went on to become a TV reporter and presenter for Look East and finally in 2007 became a Network Reporter covering the Midlands. Anthony still lives in Nottingham with his wife and four children, and has just finished writing his first novel.

## An extract from the speech given by Anthony during Presentation Evening:

'But there is another well known name here at this school I wanted to tell you about. I had heard of him, and you will have too, but I knew next to nothing about the man. His name was Arthur Holdich Mellows – he is that important looking chap in the painting on the wall outside this hall. I must have passed his picture hundreds of times while I was here, but all I ever knew about him was that the College was named after him and he was once the Mayor of Peterborough.



So who was Arthur Mellows? I thought I would do a bit of digging into his past. Arthur Mellows was born in 1892. I tried 'Googling' him to find just a dozen or so references about him. Not a lot to show for a man who's legacy still stands in the bricks and mortar of this school. His family tree shows he was the son of a Solicitor and Town Clerk of this city. He was bright; studying classics at Oxford, he was brave, signing up with the Huntingdonshire Cyclists Battalion when the First World War broke out; rising to the rank of Colonel. During his life he served as a solicitor and Labour Controller in Baghdad, which was an important and much fought over trading post even then. As a City Councillor Colonel Mellows was heavily involved in rolling out an ambitious education programme for Peterborough. As Mayor he opened the Lido. He was president of Peterborough RFC. His life ended abruptly at the age of 56 when he was killed in a car accident. This College was finished and named after him a year later in 1949.

So that's the man summed up in about a minute. Mellows was bright, brave, civic minded and highly respected in his day and I am quite disappointed not to have more to report. If he had been around today, he would no doubt have a Facebook site and we would be able to follow him on Twitter.

He now has about 1500 followers among the students of this College today and his legacy has helped educate tens of thousands. Of those dozen entries about him on the Internet, most of the brief lines would fit into a single tweet, and yet more than 60 years later the City and local community he helped shape is still benefiting. Taking a closer look at the man in that painting, we may consider how much of ourselves is out there on the Internet and the significance of it being there.'

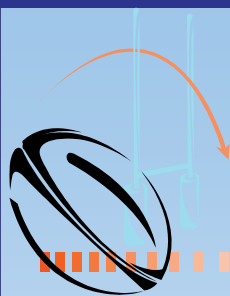
