Year 7 is a big change from Primary School and lots of people worry that they won't like it, but I can assure you that it doesn't take long to find your way at Arthur Mellows. The prospect of being part of a Form Group is completely new to most Year 7 students, but it soon becomes very comfortable and reassuring to see the same faces at the start of every day. However some people find it harder to make friends than others and this can cause friendship squabbles. No one should ever feel alone. We want to help because we care about you. There is no reason why your life in school should be made uncomfortable by the actions of others. If you are worried or concerned you must talk to a responsible adult about it.



Bullying

If you are being bullied it may seem the end of the world but it is not. Here at AMVC we have an Anti-Bullying Programme and that has kept the amount of people being bullied very low.



Who to tell?

Most people do not want to tell anyone as they think the situation will get worse. But if you do not tell anyone it won't get better.

Tell someone you can trust and they can help you, ie adults, friends, family, teachers... anyone!

Your Rights

If someone is being physically or verbally bullied they may be doing that because they are jealous but no-one has a right to hurt you. So get someone to help you solve the problem and you will have a good time at AMVC.

Getting Lost!

If you do get lost here just ask someone to help you get to your next lesson. A student or a member of staff will either give you directions or take you to where you need to be. You will soon find your way around – AMVC may seem big, but you'll soon know your way around and may be able to help others!







FOOD, GLORIOUS FOOD!





Food at AMVC is the best!

Every day the chefs in the Refectory cook up a variety of different treats for us. Students regularly take a detour on the way to Science just to get a whiff of the scrummy treats.

By break time, everyone rushes to the canteen to get the best snacks. Cheesecakes, jelly, and a different muffin every day. The muffins are amazing, so soft with many different flavours. Strawberries and Cream, Lemon and Lime, Black Forest Gateaux, the list goes on. Puddings like Apple Pie and Lemon Sponge can be bought, although by far the most popular treat is the delicious cookies.



The Refectory also serves savoury food. There are main meals, sometimes a roast dinner that you have to eat inside. However you can take the pots, which are usually pasta or curry or if you are lucky BBQ chicken wings, outside or to a club. Finally pizza and baguettes are available which can be taken away and eaten anywhere in school where food is allowed.

If you are thirsty you can buy both hot and cold drinks.

There is no need to worry about losing your money, as we have a cashless catering system which operates by pressing your finger on a scanner. Your account is individual to you and you alone. You can top it up by using the top up machines by



Student Reception. Your parents can also top up online, using their Parent Pay account. There is a daily spend limit of £5.00 and this will easily buy you a healthy, filling lunch.

Everyone at Arthur Mellows agrees that the food is great. You will definitely find yourself taking detours to the Refectory pretty soon.

HOMEWORK

Teachers give homework when they need to know that you understand something. It will always be on something covered in lesson.

There will never be anything too difficult, and if you are struggling, see the teacher and they will be more than happy to through it with you and help you until you fully understand.



The teachers recognise that you need time to complete the homework and most teachers have a homework schedule, so you're not bombarded with random homework everyday!



If you are worried about keeping on top of your homework, don't worry! Your planner is your new best friend! You can easily keep track of what's due and when, and what you need to do for the homework. It's not difficult to get your homework in on time when you've got it all written down in your planner.

Doing the homework a few days before the deadline is a good idea because if you don't understand it you have time to ask the teacher.

Homework is important

If you are having trouble with resources for homework, there is a day whereby the Library is available for your Year Group only, as well as, every Tuesday and after school.



MOBILE PHONES

Mobile Phone Protocol

Most students are likely to bring their mobile phones into school. This is okay however there are some rules around having a mobile phone in school and these are listed below:

Students bring their mobile phone to College at their own risk.



STRICT RULES!

Students are reminded that they are only allowed to bring their mobile phone into College in accordance with the following rules:

- 1. Mobile phones must be switched off and out of sight in <u>all</u> lessons unless at the specific direction of the teacher.
- 2. Phones can be used both inside and outside of the College, before school, during breaktimes and lunchtimes, but not between lessons.
- 3. Texting, making and receiving calls and listening to music are only acceptable before school and during breaktimes and lunchtimes.
- 4. The camera, video and voice recording facilities <u>cannot</u> be used in the College at any time.
- 5. Students bring their mobile phone to College at their own risk.
- 6. Students must not text or phone parents asking them to be collected from College during the day. The College will contact parents if students are required to be collected.
- 7. Students who break any of the above rules will have their phones removed, stored securely and the normal pastoral systems will take over.

BUDDY SYSTEM

The Buddy System is where you get put into groups with other people from your Form and two Sixth Form members are your leaders.

During Form Time, once a week, you will go to an area like the Sixth Form Café and spend time with your Buddies. You can tell them anything you want for example they can tell you where you go to get to your next lessons or anything really.



WHAT IF I HAVE A DOCTOR'S APPOINTMENT, OR HAVE TO GO TO THE DENTIST?



Going to the Doctors and the Dentist is still allowed during school time. You will need to show your Form Tutor your appointment letter and ask Mum, Dad or your carer to write a note in your Planner to show your Form Tutor.

At the time you leave school you will also need to sign out at Student Reception and that the card they give you to Main Reception. If your appointment is first thing in the morning (meaning you come in late in the morning), then just come into school via Main Reception.

ILLNESS OR ACCIDENT AT THE COLLEGE

If you are poorly or have an accident during the College day, you will be taken to the First Aid Room. If necessary the Aider may ring parents/carers to ask that you be collected and either taken home or advised to go to the doctors. If it is more serious an ambulance will be called and your parents or carers will be informed as soon as possible. You are not allowed to ring your parents from your own phone asking to be collected from school.

If you regularly need to take medicine during the school day, this should be handed in and kept safely in the First Aid Room.



UNIFORM

At Arthur Mellows we are very proud of our uniform. We think it looks very smart and shows what a good school we are. There are three different types of Uniform around school:

Key stage 3 (Years 7, 8 and 9)

PE KIT

We also have a really smart PE Kit.

A green top, black shorts, (leggings or a skort for girls) and black tracksuit bottoms.

We also have a really warm and comfy black PE Hoodie, but you can ONLY wear this when you have PE. Trainers must be worn, not shoes.





When you get to Year 10 and 11, if you choose to take PE or BTEC Sport as a subject choice for the GCSEs, then you have a different PE Kit, one with your name on the back!



LOCKERS

A good place to keep your PE Kit is in your locker! You have the option to have a locker which is the perfect place to store your PE kit for the week.

We highly recommend that you bring your PE kit in with you on Monday and take it home again on a Friday – this will save you forgetting it!

WHO IS WHO?

In order to recognise who is who in school, we operate a lanyard system:

Black Lanyards = Member of Staff



Yellow Lanyards = Sixth Form students



Green Lanyards = Supply Teachers



Red Lanyards = Visitors

OUR REWARDS SYSTEM

POSITIVE AND NEGATIVE SIMS POINTS

Positive SIMS points are given out by staff for all aspects of life at Arthur Mellows. Points are recorded on staff computers and can be for good work, homework, positive attitude, good manners, representing the school, being kind to others.... almost anything positive really. The points lead to emails home to parents and points go towards your Form's total. Basically, if you are positive at school you will get noticed and rewarded.




Negative SIMS points can also be given out. These are also recorded on staff computers and can be for not completing enough work in lesson, poor attitude, not completing homework, being rude etc.




OUR CLASSROOM CODE

At Arthur Mellows we believe the following:



If you are worried about getting lost, don't! There are plenty of people around to help, including me. You have already made a new friend!




