Important Reminder:

We are a mobile phone free school, including headphones / air pods, Sixth Form included. Sixth Form students have the added freedom of being able to use their phone and / or headphones / air pods in The Sixth Form Centre or IT7 (a designated IT suite for Sixth Form only).

Jeans for Genes Day

On Friday 22 September Sixth Form supported the charity fundraising event Jeans for Genes Day, a charity supporting the advancement of research and support for genetic diseases. Students were invited to wear jeans and contribute a small donation (suggestion of £1) which has gone directly to the charity. As part of their fundraising, they also held a 'Denim Dress Contest' whereby teams entered and were issued with a pair of jeans. They then had 20 minutes to design and make a garment with limited resources. Our winning team made a fabulous top, with an added ruffle on the shoulder. In total, we raised £322.63. A huge thank you to our young people for helping raise awareness and funds.

Year 13: UCAS 2024

University applications are now open and students applying for courses through UCAS have started this process with their tutors. In the Summer Term, students took part in a two-day Future Festival which gave them lots of guidance re. UCAS. Please find the support booklet attached to the Destinations Evening email which gives students advice on making competitive applications. For those students wanting to apply to Oxbridge, Veterinary Science, Medicine and Dentistry the application deadline is Friday 6 October.

For students applying for other courses, the deadline for their personal statement first draft is Friday 13 October (submitted to Professional Tutors). All applications need to be submitted by Friday 8 December to be processed and sent to UCAS. Predicted grades will be shared with students via their reports, however they can ask for this in advance if needed for decisions.

Silver and Gold Cards

Silver Cards: Year 12 students have now been issued their Silver Card. These allow students to leave site during break and lunch. This is a Sixth Form privilege and will be removed if a student fails to submit work on time, is late to school or for misconduct.

Gold Cards: Year 13 students who have completed their enrichment, leadership hours and have no attendance concerns have now been issued their Gold Card. These allow students to leave site during their free periods, break and lunch. This is a Sixth Form privilege and will be removed if a student fails to submit work on time, is late to school or for misconduct.

Late Gate

As a reminder, all students are expected to be on site by 8.35am otherwise they have to report to "late gate" where a sanction will be issued. Parents / carers will be informed of this too. Should a student have exceptional circumstances for being late, we ask that the student themself reports to IT6 second break to explain this where the sanction will be removed. We request that parents / carers support this and do not email / call the College regarding this to promote student independence and accountability in Sixth Form.



Dress Code

Students have all been reminded about the Sixth Form Dress Code. As we have started the new term, a few areas have been addressed and clarified with students. These include:

- Skirts should be of an appropriate length (knee length or below)
- Tops should be of a suitable material, not transparent and not cropped
- No trainers, jeans or hoodies
- Hair colour should be of a natural shade
- Piercings should be discreet facial piercings are restricted to 1 nose stud

Any student who does not adhere to the Dress Code in the first instance, will be spoken to by their Professional Tutor and then by a member of the Sixth Form Leadership Team if the issue persists. You will be contacted as parents if dress code continues to be an issue and the student may be asked to change / sent home to change. A copy of our Dress Code is attached for your reference.
