The A Level Drama and Theatre course requires students to develop an in depth knowledge of a number of theatre styles and practitioners. A Level in Drama and Theatre is a practical, engaging and creative subject. It provides opportunities to interrogate drama and the work of others, to explore a range of drama as a practical art form, and to work independently to create their own drama performances making informed artistic choices. Learners will study drama and theatre in an academic setting, interrogating this art form and applying their knowledge and understanding to the process of creating and developing drama and theatre and to their own performance work.

Recommended study

Students will be directed by their teachers to use their silent study sessions to research particular areas of focus. All of the texts and resources that students need for research area available in the library and in the course pack provided for the course.
