A Level course background

There are four parts to the A Level course:

- Paper 1- Physical Geography (for example, tectonics and coasts) (30%)
- Paper 2- Human Geography (for example, globalisation and migration) (30%)
- Paper 3- Synoptic paper based on an issues booklet (20%)
- Coursework linked to fieldwork in Wales (both human and physical covered with students having free choice of their title) (20%)
