A Level course background

- From September to January students will focus on developing their practical skills through teacher lead workshops and guidance. In Art the students will complete a mini project under the focus of 'Home', which will include an A1 Oil Painting. In Textiles the project focus will be 'Surfaces & Structures', which the students will project either a fashion based piece or textile interior/installation. Students will focus on the course principles of the Fine Art / Textiles specification. All assessment objectives known as AO1, AO2, AO3 and AO4 will be followed.
- In Year 12 from January students are supported through the start of their Personal Investigation. The aim of guiding them earlier through the 60% coursework element enables students to build high levels of technical skill, critical understanding and creativity in preparation for development, completion and presentation of their final coursework and adds value to their time and effort in their work across the 4 required assessment objective outcomes completed from Year 12 to Year 13.
- Students will sit a practical mock exam in Year 12 and 13 which provides them the opportunity to experience the conditions of the final exam.
- In February of Year 13 OCR send the Examination titles for the 40% Examination component. Students have until their final 15-hour practical exam to complete their preparation work and to present on A1 boards by Day 1 of the practical exam.

Assessment

- 60% coursework: Personal choice
- 40% examination: Titles issued from OCR
- Examination takes place in April / May
- The exam includes approximately 8 weeks of preparation, and a 15-hour sustained focus.
